Dear Parent/Guardian,

In the case of our current 3rd year students, we encourage them to begin to plan for their home learning and revision schedules, developing effective habits which will support their progress in the year ahead.

Revised NCCA (National Council for Curriculum and Assessment) Guidelines Regarding CBA2 Completion (3rd Year students)

We are writing to share the national schedule of **Junior Cycle - Class Based Assessments (CBAs)** - which third year students will be involved in over the coming months. CBAs are an integral part of the Junior Cycle programme, with the outcomes of subject specific Class Based Assessments an important feature of the Profile of Achievement awarded to each student on completion of the Junior Cycle learning journey.

The NCCA Guidelines for the academic year 2023-24 support the completion of one CBA in a range of subjects (aside from those listed below). Subjects listed in the table below are required by NCCA to complete CBA 2 during 3rd Year.
